The Wonderworker Saint

A little girl was sent to the store with specific instructions to come right home after her purchase. But it was more than two hours before she returned, much to the distress of her anxious mother. “Where have you been?” she scolded.

“I’m sorry, Mommy. I know I’m late, but Ann broke her doll and I had to help her fix it.”

“And just how were you able to help her fix that broken doll?”

In her precious, childlike manner the girl responded, “I really couldn’t, but I sat down with her and helped her cry.”

St. Gerard Majella is considered the patron of mothers-to-be. If your middle name is Gerard or you know someone by that name, it is very likely that St. Gerard’s intercession was invoked at the time of birth. He continues to offer hope when life seems fragile or broken. Unlike many theologians of his time who often appeared remote and lofty, Gerard had a childlike manner that allowed him to accompany people on their journey, and help them laugh tears of joy or cry tears of sorrow.

October 16 is the feast day of St. Gerard Majella. He was a contemporary of the Redemptorist founder, St. Alphonsus Liguori, and a member of the Congregation to which St. John Neumann and Blessed Francis X. Seelos belonged. Especially during October, people around the world celebrate “the wonderworker,” as St. Gerard was known even during his lifetime (1726-1755). He is perhaps the Redemptorist saint with the most widespread appeal and popular devotion, and he is a source of constant help and inspiration to all parents.

We Celebrate Our Beloved Saint

With this issue of the *League of St. Gerard Newsletter*, we join the Redemptorist world as they begin a year of special celebration in honor of our beloved saint. It was in 1904 that Pope St. Pius X canonized Gerard Majella as a saint of the universal Church. December 11, 2004, will mark the 100th anniversary of that grace-filled event. Then one year from now—October 16, 2005—will mark the 250th anniversary of Brother Gerard's death. Thus, the Redemptorist Congregation has declared a special **Year of St. Gerard Majella** from October 2004 through October 2005.

Just think...for two and a half centuries, St. Gerard has been interceding with God on behalf of others.

St. Gerard's Promises

When he was near death, Gerard made a pact with a priest whose family were dear friends with him. We can be certain that the promises Gerard made to Father Salvadore he also promises to any of us who are devoted to him.

- I. The abovementioned Reverend Brother Gerard binds himself to pray effectively to the Lord in a special way in all his prayers so that we may see each other for all eternity in the glory of paradise, enjoying God.
- II. To help me in all my spiritual and temporal needs, even though from far off, when I commend myself to him with my voice or with my heart.
- III. To get me strength to fulfill in a holy manner my obligations, to seek the sanctification of everyone, to flee from offending the Lord, and to purify me of all imperfections.
- IV. To pray to the Lord for the spiritual and temporal health of all those in my house and for the tranquility and universal peace of this region.
- V. Furthermore, he obliges himself to all those spiritual helps in this life and the next.
- VI. And also to request that all the penitents whom he knows may acquire a perfect obedience.

Patron Saint of Mothers and Babies

 In this 100th anniversary of the canonization of St. Gerard Majella, the Redemptorists are circulating a petition to ask the Holy Father to have St. Gerard formally proclaimed throughout the whole Church as "Patron Saint of Expectant Mothers and Their Babies." He has already been officially declared as such in southern Italy, where he lived and died. In many other places throughout the world, expectant mothers pray to him as their patron, and many have received miracles from his intercession.


A letter to Sister Teresa of Divine Love


