

Pilgrimage to Materdomini Site of the Tomb of Saint Gerard Majella Attracts Pilgrims

Materdomini in southern Italy is home to an ancient chapel dedicated to Santa Maria Materdomini. On October 16, 1755, Gerard Majella died in this chapel and was buried there. He was canonized in 1904. At the shrine of St. Gerard Majella at Materdomini you can visit the new and old basilica, where the tomb of Saint Gerard Majella is located.

Redemptorist Bro. John Matthys, C.Ss.R. experienced a faith-defining pilgrimage to the Shrine of St. Gerard Majella in Materdomini, Italy. He shares with you here his experiences from that trip.

ome eight years ago, I and 60 of my English-speaking Redemptorist confreres from around the world had the privilege and the honor to attend a Redemptorist Spirituality workshop in Rome. Completing our experience were visitations to holy shrines associated with the Redemptorists.

One momentous day of our journey, we boarded buses and made our way to the shrine and burial crypt of St. Gerard Majella at Materdomini (Italy). The crowds were enormous, as dozens of tour buses filled the vast parking lot that led to the older church where St. Gerard is entombed. Just behind this older church is a very spacious church that can accommodate the large groups of pilgrims. I was deeply moved being in the presence of St. Gerard's tomb. This was truly holy ground, and all the pilgrims seemed to recognize the sacredness of this holy place.

We had the opportunity to see the



room in which St. Gerard both lived and died. Above the door of his room,

St. Gerard placed this sign:

"Here the will of God is done, when God wills it, as God wills it, and as long as God wills it."

The lower level of this holy shrine was a museum honoring St. Gerard. Large framed paintings lined the walls, depicting many events in his brief religious Redemptorist life. We viewed some of his artwork of the Redeemer and Mary, the Madonna.

There is a very special room which, for the lack of a better term, I will call "The St. Gerard Miracle Room." This rather immense space has hundreds of thousands of blue and pink ribbons hanging from the ceiling and walls, all representing a special favor or miracle granted by Almighty God through the intercession of St. Gerard. On another wall, surrounding both a life-size statue and large, framed painting of St. Gerard, there are thousands and thousands of photographs. The collage, behind protective glass, includes pictures of children, mothers with their children, and photos of entire families—all sent to the St. Gerard Shrine in thanksgiving to God for favors received through St. Gerard's intercession.

Lighted votive candles adorn almost every corner of this room! I was completely surprised and amazed by what I saw! St. Gerard is interceding and taking our modest petitions to the very throne of God! This entire space revealed a man of prayer, simplicity, loving of God and having complete confidence in God. St. Gerard Majella demonstrates still today that he promotes human life and desires that all the followers of Jesus do the same. I believe that if we follow the example of St. Gerard, we too will experience God's special love for us and for those so dear to us.

St. Gerard is truly alive and his presence can be felt by through devotion that is so prevalent. Almighty God is certainly using his son Gerard to touch peoples' hearts and souls. May God reveal His presence to us through our heartfelt association with St. Gerard, The Mothers' Saint.

What is the relationship between living, witnessing and preaching the Gospel and a devout relationship with holy St. Gerard Majella? The story of Barbara and Jim illustrates this intimate connection.

the God. St. Gerard strove to emulate the love and worship shown to the Father by Jesus, as well as the greater commitment to live according to the Gospel in loving communion with God and all that God has created.

Devotion to saints, like evangelization, is about passing on the gift of faith and helping people to know God in a real, experiential way. God is the One who loves, heals, strengthens and feels compassion for you. You see these traits revealed most especially in the mysteries of the Incarnation of the Word and the Life, Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Faith is a gift that only God can bestow on those who seek God's merciful face.

This gift of faith comes to you through the living and preaching of the Word, as well as the witness of love-filled people.

These living testimonies include a special love and devotion for the friends of God who the Church recognizes as saints. By the grace of God, our saints lived heroically holy lives. Following Mary's example, the saints always point to Jesus, who leads you to the Father through the gift and life of the Holy Spirit dwelling within you.

We Are Called to Live and Proclaim the Gospel

Evangelization is the fundamental mission of the whole Church. Our proclamation of the Gospel to people today is a service rendered both to the Christian community and all of humanity. Our efforts can be oppressed by fear and distress, but ultimately lifted up by hope in Christ.

All the People of God are called to live and proclaim the Gospel from the moment of baptism. Our Yes! to God includes a commitment to make God's redeeming love known to the whole world. This is a saintly task, and all the saints of God are called to make God's love known in all places and at all times—each according to his or her station in life.

Evangelization does not consist of only the preaching and teaching of doctrine. Evangelization must touch life. First, the natural life to which it gives new meaning, thanks to the evangelical perspectives that it reveals. Second, the supernatural life, which is not the negation but the purification and elevation of the natural life. The role of evangelization is precisely to educate people in the faith in such a way as to lead each individual Christian to live a sacramental and evangelical life of faith.

Popular religiosity, which includes our devotion to the saints, is an important form of evangelization. It manifests a thirst for God which the simple and poor know best. It makes people capable of generosity and sacrifice to the point of heroism. Popular religiosity involves an acute awareness of the profound providence and loving, constant presence of God. It engenders interior attitudes rarely observed elsewhere with the same passion: patience, devotion, openness and self-sacrifice. Because of these aspects, we readily call it "popular piety"—the religion of the people.

The Saints Are Role Models for How to Live the New Life of Grace

The saints teach you how to live the Gospel in the con-

Devotion to the saints, is an important form of evangelization. crete, historical context of day-to-day life. They did this heroically, overcoming all kinds of obstacles, weaknesses, and failures.

Becoming a saint is something done in you by the grace of God, but always with your active and conscious participation. God totally and absolutely respects your freedom to choose to love or to not love.

The saints are your role models, giving you examples of how to live the new life of grace. They inspire you and lead you to God through Jesus Christ. Their witness is pleasing to God. God is never jealous of his saints and their place in our life of faith. God loves all his saints and is happy to designate one or the other for some specific purpose, such as St. Gerard Majella as The Mothers' Saint.

St. Gerard lived the gospel. He was a true disciple of Jesus Christ. He and Jesus had the same God. He had a profound trust in God. He learned early and never forgot the fundamental importance of seeking the will of God in all things. He knew that a loving, merciful God can only will what is best for you.

Too often you and I cannot see what is best for us, nor understand what is happening. Yet faith calls for trust, at times blindly, in God who does love us. He loves us in every moment and place, absolutely and unconditionally. In the end, the living God of Life will raise us up and fill us with an eternal life.
